



Qualitative Assessment of Freshwater and Comparison with World Health Organization Standards in Vicinities of Uthal City, Pakistan: A Case Study

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Abstract—This exploration study was directed in the regions of Uthal city in district Lasbela, the drinking water tests gathered from various focuses, and tried for quality evaluation. The Physio-chemical appraisal of water was done. The acquired outcomes were contrasted and international standards of drinking water, the interesting properties including pH, Turbidity, Chlorine, Electrical Conductivity (EC), Potassium, Total Dissolved Solids (TDS), and bicarbonates. Additionally, most of the parameters were deviating from international standards.
